Directions: Study the chart in your groups, answer the following questions.	
1.	Outliers from the trend line are rare: the upper left portion and lower right portion of the chart are almost empty. What does this mean?
2.	Regions (color-coded) are often grouped together. This is especially true of Africa and Europe. What does this mean?
3.	Asia seems to be an exception to the grouping with countries all along the trend line. What might explain this?
4.	Students may ask about countries like Lesotho, Swaziland, Central African Republic, North Korea, Equatorial Guinea, or Qatar. These countries are located somewhat off the trend line. Why?
5.	What factors might differentiate countries along the same vertical or horizontal axes (for example, along the vertical axis that separates level 3 from level 4, why might Russia have a much lower life expectancy than Greece?)
